The eTwinning community- an educational gate to Europe

English pages for all is one of our e-twinning projects. Students aged between 9 and 12 took part in this project coordinated by AnetaWilk (Poland), Nicoleta Militaru (Romania), Adela Urbanova (Slovakia), and Tuire Kokko (Finland). Art High School "Ionel Perlea" was represented by the following students: Ghiţă Diana Maria, Surugiu Mariana, Mitu Ruxandra, Neagu Bogdan, Petrescu Adrian, Bărbucianu Marga, Gheorghe Ştefan, Cîrlan Raluca, Petric Vladuţ şi Brăcaci Andrei.

The project was organized around some activities: the introduction of the partners (both teachers and students)- by short films posted on the blog of the project as well as by messages on the forum; What do you know about my country?- each team of students made presentations about their country, the flag, the national anthem, drawings and quizzes using Padlet; National traditions- each team worked on presentations about spring and winter traditions (March Amulets and Christmas in Romania) as well as national recipes (which were included in a Prezi collection of food) and finally, Our Stories- each team presented traditional stories together with drawing made by them. Also, the Romanian team prepared a set of riddles about characters in the stories all children know.

I believe that all students had the possibility to enrich their vocabulary and also their abilities to communicate in English as well as their abilities of using a computer. We loved the min maps, the crosswords prepared by our teachers and especially the postcards we got from our Polish partners. In the Pupils Corner, we could leave messages and questions for the other students and we worked on different project ideas.

I also think that the activities in the project really developed students' creativity and imagination. At the end, the project was evaluated both in Romania and Poland and it was awarded both the National Quality Certificate and the European Quality Label. We are very proud of our work and we are looking forward to a new e-twinning project!
