## LESSON PLAN – TEACHING COMPOUND WORDS THROUGH GAMES

**GRADE:** 5<sup>th</sup>

LEVEL: A1

TEXTBOOK: Snapshot Starter, Longman

TIME: 50 minutes

TYPE OF LESSON: Teaching-learning

**ANTICIPATED PROBLEMS:** 

Students may not understand all compound words

**AIM:** to present and practice compound words

**SPECIFIC COMPETENCES:** 

By the end of the lesson students will be able to:

> match up the halves to make compounds;

- identify compound words in a text;
- > define compound words;
- > fill in the sentences with the appropriate compound words

THE LESSON  Lead-in	5'	Students are shows the cover of the book "Once there was a bullfrog", written by Rick Walton.  "Have you read this book?" (Yes/No)  They are then told that they are going to listen to the book read to them and while listening they have to complete the worksheet with the missing words.
